## Description of Associations Included in *PharmacyWeek's* 2009 Bonus Mailings, On-Site Distribution, and Door Drops

**AACP:** Founded in 1900, the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy (AACCP) is the national organization representing the interests of pharmacy education and educators. Comprising all 105 U.S. pharmacy colleges and schools including more than 4,300 faculty, 48,500 students enrolled in professional programs, and 3,600 individuals pursuing graduate study, AACCP is committed to excellence in pharmacy education.

**ABHP:** The Association of Black Health-system Pharmacists (ABHP) strives to promote advocacy, leadership, education, and collaboration that improves the health, status and quality of life of black and minority patients and to advance and promote the practice of black and minority pharmacists in the health systems. When you join ABHP, you can interact and combine forces with colleagues and various health care organizations throughout the nation in addressing issues associated with minority patient healthcare. ABHP Provides up-to-date educational programs to help practitioners improve their professional knowledge in the areas of minority health. The achievements and contributions of our members, students, and community leaders are also recognized with prestigious awards.

**ACCP (2):** The American College of Clinical Pharmacology (ACCP) strives to be the premier professional society with the size, influence and diversity of membership consistent with the breadth of the discipline of clinical pharmacology. Members of the College are employed in academia, the pharmaceutical industry, contract clinical research organizations, private practice or government.

**AMCP:** The Academy of Managed Care Pharmacy's mission is to empower its members to serve society by using sound medication management principles and strategies to achieve positive patient outcomes. AMCP has more than 5,200 members nationally who provide comprehensive coverage and services to the more than 200 million Americans served by managed care.

**ASCP:** The American Society of Consultant Pharmacists (ASCP) is the international professional association which provides leadership, education, advocacy, and resources to advance the practice of senior care pharmacy. ASCP's 8,000 members manage and improve drug therapy and improve the quality of life of geriatric patients and other individuals residing in a variety of environments, including nursing facilities, subacute care and assisted living facilities, psychiatric hospitals, hospice programs, and in home and community-based care.

**ASHP:** The American Society of Health-system Pharmacists (ASHP) is the 35,000-member national professional association which represents pharmacists who practice in hospitals, health maintenance organizations, long-term care facilities, home care, and other components of health care systems. ASHP, which has a long history of medication-error prevention efforts, believes that the mission of pharmacists is to help people make the best use of medicines. Assisting pharmacists in fulfilling this mission is ASHP's primary objective.

**ASPEN:** The American Society for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition (ASPEN) is a professional organization whose members are involved in the provision of clinical nutrition therapies, including parenteral and enteral nutrition. Its nearly 5,500 members are physicians, nurses, dietitians, pharmacists, scientists and other allied health professionals.

**BPS:** The Board of Pharmaceutical Specialties was established in 1976 by the American Pharmacists Association (APhA) in response to changes occurring in health care and in pharmacy practice and to consider the issue of specialization in pharmacy practice. The mission of BPS is to improve public health through recognition and promotion of specialized training, knowledge, skills in pharmacy, and certification of pharmacist specialists. Nearly 6,500 pharmacists are currently certified in one or more of the following specialties: nuclear pharmacy, nutrition support pharmacy, oncology pharmacy, pharmacotherapy, and psychiatric pharmacy.

**CPNP:** The College of Psychiatric & Neurologic Pharmacists' mission is to promote excellence in pharmacy practice, education and research in order to optimize the treatment outcomes of individuals affected by psychiatric and neurologic disorders. CPNP's 925+ person membership consists of pharmacists and other medical professionals who specialize in the optimal use of medications for people with psychiatric and neurologic disorders. As a member of a multidisciplinary team, psychiatric pharmacists are responsible for optimizing drug treatment and patient care by conducting patient assessments, recommending treatment plans, monitoring patient response, and recognizing drug-induced problems.

**HOPA:** The Hematology/Oncology Pharmacy Association (HOPA) is a nonprofit professional organization launched in 2004 in order to help oncology and hematology pharmacy practitioners and their associates provide the best possible cancer care. HOPA's membership includes not just oncology pharmacists, but also pharmacy interns, residents, nurses, technicians, researchers, and administrators specializing in hematology/oncology practice.

**NYSCHP:** Founded in 1958 as the New York State Council of Hospital Pharmacists, the New York State Council of Health-system Pharmacists (NYSCHP) is a professional society of 2,100 pharmacists, pharmacy technical personnel, students, industry personnel and others interested in the advancement of pharmacy as an essential component of health care. Members coordinate pharmaceutical care for patients in ambulatory, long term, managed, home and acute care settings. NYSCHP is also the state affiliate of the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists.
